Summary: The manuscript describes how local political party chairs shape U.S. elections in various ways, from candidate recruitment/support to voter mobilization. Overall, using a combination of survey, experimental, and qualitative (in-person interviews with nearly 30 local party chairs) data, the manuscript establishes that chairs can affect representation, polarization, and competition, and marks an important link between the political party literature and several other areas of political science.
